Brisbane's Hamilton Hotel gets a new look!

One of Brisbane's most popular suburban hotels, Stewart's Hamilton Hotel, Hamilton, could be called a modern link with the city's early history.

The suburb of Hamilton took its name from the hotel, which was built by Gustavus Hamilton, of Toowoomba, and listed in Pugh's Almanac for 1879.

The exact year of the original hotel's construction is not known, but a painting of the building in the 1800's shows it as a large wooden structure standing in a country setting on the bank of the Brisbane River.

Even in the first half of this century the hotel looked more like a huge homestead than the modern conception of a busy hotel.

But not today.

Standing at the corner of busy Kingsford Smith Drive and Racecourse Road, the hotel is a brick structure very much in line with the image of the 70's.

Under the capable management of Mr and Mrs A. Cox, the Hamilton Hotel is really "on the go".

Mr & Mrs Cox assumed the management of the hotel 15 years ago when Mr E. Stewart took over its operation from the Aherns.

A Castlemaine Perkins hotel, it carries a huge cellar of beers, top wines and spirits for its various bars and diners.
